## Integrated Service Response – Short-Term Disability Support in a Crisis

If you are an ACT resident with disability and facing a crisis that affects your health or wellbeing, you may be able to get short-term support. This includes help coordinating services and, in some cases, funding for urgent disability support. You may be eligible even if you're waiting for an NDIS plan or not eligible due to residency.

## Crisis Payment for release from prison or psychiatric confinement

You may be able to get a Crisis Payment when you leave prison or a psychiatric hospital.

You must meet the criteria to get this payment. You can get this payment each time you are released. It is the same as one week of your normal Centrelink payment.

## Refugee and Migrant Support

### Crisis Payment for humanitarian entrants

A one-off payment if you’ve arrived in Australia as a humanitarian entrant for the first time.

You must meet certain eligibility criteria and hold a specific humanitarian visa to get this payment.
